

### TECH TALK:

On 1977 and later MGB's, the vacuum advance is only operative in fourth gear, and fourth gear overdrive.

On 1980 MGB's with electronic ignition, do not run the control lead from the electronic module over the top of your distributor cap. This can cause erratic timing when the high voltage from the coil jumps to the control lead.

When painting or boiling out the engine block on your MG, the engine ID plate can be removed easily, and without drilling. The rivets that hold this plate to the block are threaded, allowing them to be unscrewed with a pair of pliers. To re-install, simply tap these rivets in place with a small hammer. They will "thread" themselves back into the block.

## Old chrome, ragtops are in

British roadsters and big domestic cars of the 1960s seem to be the best bets for car collectors looking for a good buy or a quick buck, experts say.

Roadsters are primitive sports cars outfitted with tops that don't just fold down but come completely off. Interest in those cars has been ignited by the introduction of the Mazda Miata sports car last July.

And yesterday's road hogs are tickling collectors' fancies because they're so outrageous compared with the trim, tidy, sensible autos prowling the byways today.

Here's a look at recent picks by a pair of auto authorities:

The 1961-'65 Oldsmobile Starfire is recommended by Hollywood auto auctioneer Rick Cole and by Automotive Investor, a monthly newsletter for the serious-minded who trade old cars as if they were stocks and bonds.

Cole says go for the convertible; Automotive Investor says a hardtop is fine. Priced as low as \$6,000, the Olds could triple in value next year, the newsletter says. Cole figures it'll take five years to jump that much.

"Big American convertibles seem to be a hot area of growth," says newsletter editor Richard Langworth. "Not necessarily muscle cars but big bombs; the premium cars with lots of chrome and stainless steel and bucket seats."

Another good bet, according to *Automotive Investor*: 1957-'65 Chrysler Imperial convertible. Now: \$7,500-\$16,000. Next year: \$10,000-\$19,000.

▶ U.K.-built MG sports cars also find favor in both the newsletter and Cole's latest Gold List — cars priced under \$25,000 that he expects to zoom in value in five years.

Automotive Investor likes the 1963-'68 MGB roadster, and the '66-'74 MGB GT coupe.

The newsletter says you should be able to find an MGB for \$6,000 to \$10,000. In just one

year, it should jump in value to between \$8,500 and \$12,500.

Says the newsletter: "A good one is a bargain compared with a (Mazda) Miata after dealer pack," or markup. Miata's base price is \$13,800, but it is so popular that dealers have been charging thousands more.

Cole prefers the 1955-'62 MGA, a two-seat, bare-bones sports car that helped spawn the U.S. love affair with low-slung foreigners.

He says an MGA roadster costs \$5,000 to \$8,000 now; at least \$35,000 in five years.

Another Langworth British favorite: '64-'68 Sunbeam Tiger
— \$12,000 to \$20,000 now;

\$20,000 to \$25,000 in a year.

Auto buffs like the Tiger because it came with a compact, powerful, Ford V-8 engine and Ford transmission. The V-8's power makes the small car very quick. And — in a world of unobtainable exotic auto hardware — an engine and transmission that you can fix

by visiting the corner Ford store are godsends.

Automotive Investor polled a group of collectible-car experts to come up with its list.

"We're going to embarrass all of them a year from now and make them explain why their predictions didn't come true," jokes Langworth.
