

MY FIRST CAR

I was so excited when I came home to find a box from Moss Motors, that I quickly opened to find a new cluster gear. The next day, the remaining parts arrived. Putting the transmission back together was pretty straight forward. The only difficulty was installing the new layshaft. After the first and third motion shaft are in place, the cluster gear must be moved in place. The layshaft must be pushed through the thrust washer, the cluster gear, (which contains three needle bearing assemblies), another thrust washer, finally through the other end of the gear housing. I made the job easier by grinding a point on the old layshaft and using it as a guide to line up parts. Then I pushed the old layshaft out with the new layshaft. Everything else went together smoothly.

With the engine and transmission installed, I poured fresh oil into the gearbox and engine. Another story for another day. Until next time.

At the July meeting, a list will be presented defining the duties and responsibilities of each committee. We have limited these duties to a total of 10 areas. Volunteers will be Day 1994.

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JUST A LITTLE HOO

IT'S SUMMER TIME AND BOY IS IT HOT! YOU TURN THE IGNITION KEY TO THE START POSITION AND YOU GET NOTHING OR JUST A CLICK OR A BUZZING SOUND! COULD IT BE THE STARTER OR THE SOLENIOD? FIRST SUSPECT THE BATTERY AS THE SOURCE OF THE PROBLEM. "BUT I HAVE A MAINTANCE FREE BATTERY" YOU SAY. THERE IS NO SUCH THING AS A MAINTANCE FREE BATTERY! THAT'S SALES HIPE. YOU'LL FIND THAT NEW BATTERIES ARE NOW LABELED "LOW MAINTANCE" - THE TRUTH FORCED ON THE MANUFACTER BY THE LAW! IF YOU DO HAVE ONE OF THESE, YOU MAY FIND THAT THE CELL COVERS ARE GLUED ON TO THE BATTERY TOP. USE A SCREWDRIVER AND PRY THEM OFF. THESE BATTERIES EXPELL WATER IN THE PROCESS OF CHARGING JUST AS THE OLDER CONVENTIAL ONES DID AND THAT LOST OF WATER MUST BE REPLACED. THESE BATTERIES ARE NOT SEALED. THINK ABOUT IT. WHEN A BATTERY CHARGES, IT PRODUCES HYDROGEN GAS. THAT GAS TAKES UP MORE SPACE THAN WHEN IT IS IN COMBINATION WITH ANOTHER ELEMENT IN THIS CASE SUFURIC ACID WHICH IS A LIQUID. THE GREATER VOLUME OF THE GAS HAS TO GO SOMEWHERE AND THERE IS NO ROOM IN SIDE THE BATTERY CASE. THE HYDROGEN GAS VENTS TO THE OUTSIDE OF THE BATTERY JUST LIKE IT DID WITH THE OLDER TYPES: CARRYING WATER VAPOR WITH IT. LOW MAINTANCE BATTERIES ARE JUST ABLE TO RECOVER A GREATER PERCENTAGE OF THAT WATER THAN OLDER ONES COULD. THEY STILL NEED TO HAVE THE LOST WATER REPLACED! WITH HIGHER TEMPERATURES IN THE SUMMER TIME, THAT WATER VAPOR LOST IS EVEN GREATER. THAT'S WHY THE BATTERY'S WATER LEVEL WILL BE FINE ALL WINTER AND IT'S IN SUMMER WHEN YOU EXPERIENCE THE PROBLEM.

ONCE YOU HAVE THE BATTERY TOPPED OFF, ATTEND TO THE BATTERY TERMINALS AND POSTS. IF THE CONNECTIONS APPEAR TO BE CLEAN, DISCONNECT THEM AND CLEAN THEM WITH A WIRE BRUSH MADE FOR THE PURPOSE. IF THEY ARE COVERED WITH CORROSION, PREPARE A SOLUTION OF WATER AND BAKING SODA. COMBINE A COUPLE SPOONS OF BAKING SODA (BAKING SODA NOT BAKING POWDER- IE. ARM & HAMMER) IN A JAR OR GLASS INTO WHICH YOU CAN INSERT THE BATTERY CABLE CONNECTORS. THE SOLUTION WILL BUBBLE AND FIZZ BUT NOT TO WORRY IT WON'T BLOW UP! IT WILL TAKE A LITTLE TIME AND MOVING THE CONNECTOR AROUND WITHIN THE CONTAINER WILL HELP IN SPEEDING UP THE PROCESS. IF THE CONNECTORS ARE REAL BAD, CHANGE TO FRESH SOLUTION. ONCE THEY ARE CLEANED INSPECT TO SEE IF REPLACEMENT IS IN ORDER. BECAREFUL NOT TO GET ANY SOLUTION INTO THE BATTERY AS IT WILL NEUTRALIZE THE ACID IN THE BATTERY. RINSE THE CONNECTORS WITH PLAIN WATER; CLEAN THE BATTERY POSTS AND CABLE CONNECTORS WITH A WIRE BRUSH AND TIGHTEN. ONE LAST THING TO CHECK IS THE SECURITY OF THE OTHER END OF THE GROUND CABLE. IT'S BEST TO DISCONNECT IT AND CLEAN IT.

RINSE THE BATTERY AND THE SURROUNDING AREA WITH WATER TO WASH AWAY ANY BATTERY ACID OR SODA. ATTEMPT TO START THE CAR. IF IT STARTS, ALLOW IT TO RUN FOR 10 TO 15 MINUTES IN ORDER TO RECHARGE THE BATTERY. IF THE BATTERY IS BUBBLING THROUGH IT'S VENTS, RINSE WITH WATER TO REMOVE ACID.

IF THE CAR STILL WILL NOT START, TRY CHARGING/ JUMPING THE BATTERY. IF STILL NO RESULTS, CONSIDER THE NEED FOR A NEW BATTERY. REMEMBER, BATTERIES WHICH HAVE BEEN ALLOWED TO OPERATE FOR LONG PERIODS WITH VERY LOW WATER LEVELS OFTEN DO NOT LAST VERY LONG DISPITE SERVICING.


As I said before, give me feedback, let me know your feelings on meeting at Russell's Short Stop both positive and negative.


Start with fresh fuel and then do your tuning and/or parts replacement. This problem has confused some really knowledgable club members. Do not let it get you!
