



IN MY TRAVELS

Well, I did it again! A friend of mine (non-club member) asked me to check out a British car that he was thinking of purchasing. He said that it was a MGB-GT. Turned out that it was a '73 Triumph GT6 Mark III, yellow in color. It was a California tagged car and had been repainted. The repaint was not the best, but was the original color. The car had no rust, top or bottom, despite the fact that it was not undercoated! It ran well and the only negative was the fact that it was not equipped with an overdrive. I did spot three mechanical problems. The clutch master cylinder was almost dry of fluid. There was no fluid to be seen around the master cylinder, so I concluded that the slave cylinder was leaking. However, the clutch operation felt fine. The exhaust system leaked at a point somewhere midway under the car, which was no big deal. The biggest problem was the rear suspension transverse spring which was flattening out causing the rear wheels to sit in unusual positions. The problem was not caused by other suspension parts, as they had been changed. So, considering the asking price, I deemed the car a worth while buy. Especially, if I could talk my friend into joining our club and he was willing to under take the necessary repair work with some assistance from me.

I kind of liked the car myself and told him that if he did not buy the car in a few weeks that I just might. After a month, he had still not purchased the car. A six weeks passed and did not know if he had done so or not. I had a dental appointment in Metairie and just could not resist going to see if the car was still available. Over the past weeks, I had made all the arguments with myself, pro and con, and my desire to have the car had won out! The car was still available and I could not help but make an as is offer for the car. My offer was accepted. There was only one hitch. The owner had missed placed the California state title and would have to obtain a duplicate. We agreed that the deal was done, but that I would not supply any cash until the duplicate title was in hand. A delay of about a week would be necessary before I would have the car in my possession.

Well, the deal fell through. The owner made excuses, too much trouble to get another title, wife wants to keep the car, being transferred, etc. I was all ready to receive the car. Ordered catalogs, made plans, etc. I guess that I just was not meant to have that car. I really want a Triumph 250 anyway, I think!

ANTI-FREEZE HASSLE

Tired of reading charts on Anti-freeze containers in order to determine how much to pour into your radiator? Here is an easy way to do it.

From a gallon of Anti-freeze pour half of it into another container. A clean plastic milk container will do. Then fill both containers with plain water. Label all containers as to their contents for safety reasons. Now you have two 1 gallon containers of 50% Anti-freeze. A 50% mixture is a good blend for all the hot or cold temperatures you will encounter in the south. A 70% blend is the maximum mixture recommended by the manufacture and any greater mixture will not work better but, in fact, will reduce the desired effects. In this case, more is not better. With premixed Anti-freeze, you can be sure that you have the proper blend of Anti-freeze and water in your cooling system. Make sure that you drain the block and not just the radiator to ensure complete drainage of the old fluid.

To be certain that no air is trapped in the cooling system, run the engine until the thermostat opens. Or take a short run with a container of mixed Anti-freeze just in case the engine temperature goes too high. This is the only way to free trapped air from some cooling systems. If adding fluid is necessary, release the radiator cap very slowly. Steam can burn your hand! Get a cap with a release lever and this will be no longer a concern for you.


Use Ant-freeze and change it <u>at least</u> every two years in your older British car. If you do not, you are destroying your engine from the inside out. You are putting at risk head gaskets, water pumps, etc. and clogging the cooling system's passages.

No more charts, no more guessing! Simple and easy!

BMCNO CAR DAY UPDATE



TECH SESSION REPORT




