

IN MY TRAVELS by Jim Jones

Well, the holidays have slowed work on British cars down somewhat, but some things have been going on. I traveled to **Peter Brauen's** shop in Bay St. Louis, Mississippi from Mandeville, Louisiana with **Mike Schrantz**. We transported his Austin Healey 100 BN2 to Peter's for completion of frame and panel work. The trip was uneventful.

Uneventful, because Mike has a good trailer and because he has rigged it and his tow vehicle very well. The car being carried on the trailer is secured using a system which utilizes straps sewn together in the shape of half of a tire over the top half of both of the front wheels. The strapping is secured to the trailer frame by large clamps designed for that purpose and tightened using cranks. The rear of the car is secured with regular straps which each have tensioning cranks and are

held to the trailer frame by large buckles. The trailer itself is large and heavy with its four tandem wheels mounted aft of center, but it can easily carry any car from a Jaguar MKII to an MGB. Mike's tow vehicle is equipped with a receiver hitch and rear air shocks.



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This ingeniously designed personal light is especially handy for map reading, navigation, as an "executive" light for rear passengers, or even as a permanent service light under the hood.

The lamp unit is mounted to the end of a strong, flexible, 18 inch, chrome-plated tube which adjusts to, and holds, any desired position. The bulb cow adjusts to illuminate a large or small area and at the same time shields light from driver's eyes. A convenient built-in switch is mounted in the base. Complete installation kit include anchor clip, wiring, mounting bolts with hex nuts, self tapping screws, and simple instructions.

I found some coolant on the ground underneath the Morris Minor the other day. The original water pump seal finally gave out. Well, it did last for thirty years. A catalog part is usually never on sale when I need it. But, this time it was on sale by Mini-Mania. Now, all I have to do is wait for four or five days for the UPS guy to deliver it.

You must always think about the other parts that you will need when replacing a major part. In the case of a water pump, there are several other parts to consider. Not all pumps come with the gasket included. Order a gasket. It is cheap insurance against not having one when you need it. If your pump has a by-pass fitting, ordering a new hose is wise. It is easy to replace the hose as you install the new pump. It is next to impossible to install it with the pump in place. The lower fitting to which the by-pass hose is secured will not come with the new pump and is usually badly corroded. Order it, if not both upper and lower ones. The original hose clamps are nice, but the worm gear type works much better.

A paper gasket is usually supplied and does not need sealant applied. If you feel the need for sealant, use it sparingly. A light smear on both sides of the gasket with your finger is enough. Excessive sealant just oozes outside and inside the mating surfaces. On the outside it just looks nasty. On the inside it can dislodge, travel along with the coolant, and plug up a small water passage way.

Be cool and check the condition of the fan belt before you order those other new parts.

NOVEMBER PLANATION CRUISE by Cathy Greensfelder

The River Plantation Cruise looked like it was going to be a bust: the sky was dark, overcast, and it was threatening to rain. But, eighteen members showed up in Kenner, eight in British cars. To paraphrase one driver, a bad day driving your British car is better than a gorgeous day at the office, so we headed out. We took Airline Hwy. to Sorrento, then swung south to the Houmas House and Tezcuco. We pulled in just long enough to check out the gift shop and the antique shop respectively. Lunch at Oak Alley worked out really well. We hit them at a quiet time and they were able to seat almost all of us together. The restaurant is located in a small cottage with seating in each of the different rooms of the house. The Laura Plantation has only been open to the public for a few years, so no one in the group had seen it before. The tour was really fascinating. Even the members who have been to lots of other plantation tours were impressed by the guide. She truly brought the house and its early Creole residents to life for us. The tour lasted nearly an hour and included numerous anecdotes involving the first three generations of Laura's owners.

By the end of the tour, however, it was looking like serious rain so we skipped driving to the San Francisco Plantation and the Destrehan Plantation and everyone went their separate ways home.

TECH SESSION REPORT by Jim Jones

The Tech Session went well. Despite the cold weather, the turn out was good. Floyd and Anne Friloux placed a number of heat producing devices around the our work area in their warehouse and provided us with good strong hot coffee. Some chocolates were also available for those of us who cannot resist them. The sun shone brightly warming the warehouse roof and the outside temperature was not as low as had been predicted. I wore two pair of pants and felt quite comfy in my heavy long sleeve shirt. I had to shed my jacket.

The only real problem that we had to overcome was how to jack up the rear end of **Keith Vezina's** late model MGB once it was on the lift. We placed a floor jack on the concrete under the car's rear end with the lift in its lowest position, operated the jack, and then place jack stands under the front mounting brackets of the rear springs. The jack stands were placed on top of a thick board positioned across the top of the lift's ramps. We then lowered the floor jack and raised the lift. I did not have to figure this out. Once the group was told what the problem was, they solved it quickly.

Although none of the group had seen this procedure done before, they were able to detect any mistakes or misstatements that I had made. I had not performed this task for about four years now and I was a little rusty. But, their questioning of me was with a good nature. Keith helped a lot by doing the remedial tasks, such as removing the differential's rear cover, etc. Some of the group socialized during the jacking of the car and the pulling of the left hand half shaft, but they were all interested when I got to the differential itself. The job went well and I think that I covered all the bases.

We did not finish the session until after 2 o'clock in the afternoon, but that did not stop us from having a late lunch at the "Rib Shack" on Williams Blvd. in Kenner. Loved that rib plate!

The deadline for submitting concepts of the T-shirt design this year has been extended to January 28, the date of the General Membership Meeting.






A friend, a mentor, "last of the good old guys". I do miss you, Frank.
