

Hound & Hare Rallye by Cathy Greensfelder

Roger Gibson put on a short "Hound & Hare" rallye after the regular meeting on Tuesday August 27. In a "Hound & Hare" rallye, one driver (Roger) is the "Hare". He leaves first to run a preplanned course. About 100 feet before each turn, the Hare sprays a splash of paint on the road. About 100 feet after each turn, he spays another splash of paint.

The other drivers are the "Hounds". They are each given a sealed "emergency" envelope with the address of the end point, then they



start leaving at about 2 minutes intervals. When a driver sees the paint, he knows that at the next opportunity to legally change directions, he must make a decision: left, right or straight. But there is no indication of which way. If the Hound guesses right, he will see a second marker in 100 feet. If he guesses wrong, he won't see a marker and will have to turn around & go the other way. The winner is the driver that completes the course with emergency envelope intact and the lowest mileage, not time.

The course was 5.1 miles from the Italian Pie to the Coffee Cottage on Citrus. About 10 cars participated and two, Mike Anderson and Wayne Aucoin with his fiancé Joyce made it with "emergency" envelopes intact. Mike finished in 5.5 miles and took home the prize, a nice looking canvas tool bag! Talk about some good guessing! Butch Frutos kidded that he thought he racked up over 30 miles guessing wrong! I ran the course and got lost (no surprise!!) but after opening the envelope I did manage to find the Coffee Cottage on my own, with only the help of my trusty, New Orleans area map! §

Dorset Madness #4 by Jim Jones

Major work on my '49 Austin Dorset has slowed down. I am waiting on the guy who does media blasting and priming. I am "on his list" to get the work done, but no time schedule has been given. The structural work to be done by Peter Brauen of BMC Restorations cannot begin until after the blasting work has been completed.

I have been occupied, however. I have been constructing a custom wiring harness for the

Dorset. I started with a harness from a late '71 to early '72 MGB. Club member Cliff Hughes donated this used harness to me from his home attic archives.

I removed the harness' outer wrappings (blue non-sticky tape) leaving only the black fabric tape at the breakouts. This tape is very messy, but I left it in place until I had removed all the wires that I did not need (wires for modern stuff like key buzzers, & such).

Next I removed the black tape, replace it with wire ties, and cleaned the sticky mess off the remaining wires with mineral spirits. I stopped work at this point and went to my computer.

I scanned the MGB diagram into a file and deleted the wires that I had physically removed from the harness. The use of 8 1/2" X 14" paper gave me a great deal more space in which to work.

Back to the harness. I temporally installed the inner fender wells, radiator, and dash on the Dorset. This allowed me to put the harness in place and begin to insert needed wires and change the breakout points of all the wires to suit the car's needs.

Of course, things keep changing all the time. The MGB never had an Amp gauge like the Dorset. So I had to add those heavy gauge brown wires. The Dorset's ignition switch is just an off-on switch. With air condition (a period FrigiKing unit) envisioned, I will need a more modern ignition switch with accessory and start positions. The MGB wiring uses separate turning signal single filament bulbs. The Dorset used an "8-way relay unit" and single double filament bulbs on each side of the car for all rear light functions (signal, brake, & running lights). Examples can go on and on.

But everything is being accomplished, however slowly. Eventually, not only will the Dorset have a custom wiring harness, but its own custom wiring harness diagram as well.



Run On Problem Solved! by Jim Jones

This is a follow up article about Charles Ake's MGB. Charles' engine would continue to run even after the ignition key was turned to the "off" position and the key was removed! This problem has been driving me crazy.

I had another opportunity to trouble shoot the problem after Charles and I converted his rubber bumper MGB front suspension to wire wheels and he left the car at my garage overnight. We will install a wire wheel rear end assembly later.



The problem had me confused. All I knew for

certain was that it had something to do with the alternator and/or the ignition warning light wiring. This car has had a lot of "creative" rewiring by previous owners. I disconnected the ignition warning light wires under the bonnet and rigged up the temporary ignition warning light circuit under the bonnet and the problem went away!



This lead me to believe that the cause of the problem was some other wire shorting together with one of the ignition warning light wires located in the main or dash wiring harness. Not wanting to unwrap both harnesses to locate the real cause of the problem, I decided to desert the original wires for the ignition warning lamp and run two new wires.

Everything now works as it should. I feel so much better now!
