Chinese Driving 2010 by Rick Huber

I couldn't resist writing a little something about the driving adventures over here in China.

Rick

No MG over here in China, in fact I can't even drive at all. I don't know whether it's the foreigner protection or full employment laws, but they make it very difficult for foreigners to drive. The company provides a car and a driver for transportation from Shanghai to the plant about 32 miles south in Caojing. It would be nice being chauffeured around, except that it's mostly white knuckle riding, but at a snail's pace - the commute takes anywhere from 1 to 2 hours, although it was only 48 minutes when I went in at 11 after we watched the Saints win the Super Bowl. Hard for you to imagine white knuckle riding at a snail's pace? Try multiple lane changes in every direction as cars try to squeeze each other out of their lanes to get a one or two car advantage in the traffic jam, with horns blaring everywhere. I miss the open top motoring, but this isn't the place where we'd want to drive our cars.

They've come a long way since 1993 when I visited. Back then, bicycles outnumbered every other form of wheeled transportation. One slab of blacktop from town to town with no markings served pedestrians, bicycles, scooters, motorcycles, wagons, carts, cars, busses, and trucks. When a truck passed a car that was passing a cart that was passing a motorcycle, the stack extended way across the middle of the road into

the oncoming traffic, and the boldest driver won. I saw plenty of accidents, and I'm glad I survived.

Now its 2010. They have high rise interstate highways everywhere, and most of the bicycles, carts, and wagons have been replaced by cars and buses. Still plenty of trucks, most of which can't keep up with highway speeds going up an incline. There are still some bicycles, scooters, and motorcycles, but for the most part they stay off of the big highways, and the roads around town are marked to keep them separated.

There are cars of every variety - from tiny Chinese-made econoboxes all the way up to Lamborghinis and Ferrari's. Other than the Chinese cars, the most popular cars seem to be Volkswagens, Hondas, Toyotas, and Buicks. Yes, Buicks. A couple of reasons. The last Emperor owned one, so the Buick name commands a high level of honor and respect among the Chinese people. Capitalizing on that fact, Buick was the first factory GM built here, and it happens to be here in Shanghai. So the Buick mini van is everywhere, and several other models less so. Yes, a few Fords and Chevys too. There is a stiff 30 to 40 % import duty on imported cars, so there are few cars on the road that aren't produced here. Plenty of Buicks with the oldest Big Three factory, and now Ford and Chevy have built factories here in the last few years and are starting to

sell significant numbers.

I hadn't seen hardly any British Cars when I started writing this article, but this weekend, we were walking around the ritzy French Concession area of town, and we spotted Aston Martin and Jaguar dealerships in the same row of buildings, so we took a few pictures and had to share them and make this an authentic BMCNO article. Didn't ask the prices, but just think, it's 30 to 40 % on top of the price in US\$. Ouch!!

Volkswagens outnumber everything else, the Santana is everywhere, as ALL of the Shanghai area taxi's are that model. The deal was Volkswagen agreed with the Shanghai government to build the factory here if they could guarantee a certain volume of cars. What the Shanghai government did was write a specification for taxis that was so detailed, the only model that fit the spec was the Santana. Quite clever. So the factory was built, and Santanas are driving people to and fro all over the place.

So much for this reporter for now, I'll add some specific driving habits you won't believe next month.

Engine Oil by Floyd Friloux



Car club members still change their own oil more

than the general public. Not much other than oil and a new filter are provided for the cheapest service advertised. For the extra things we usually check when we do it ourselves, costs would reach closer to the \$50 mark.

In vehicles we drive infrequently, it is likely that spending more for a synthetic oil is probably a waste of money and even a bad idea if it gives us a

false sense of security leading to us checking the oil less often.

Stories of unnecessary engine damage have reached me. With the little we use our "collector" cars, we should check our oil nearly every time we use them (at least monthly). Quick lube places often drain oil from engine without first looking at it. If you give them a container, they will usually catch a small sample as the oil is drained.

Finding a low oil level is bad, a level over the recommended operating range can be worse and could mean fuel or water getting into your lube. If engine is run infrequently and you find more oil than expected on the stick, I

advise that you either put a piece of icemaker tubing down the dipstick tube and pull up a little liquid from bottom of crankcase to check for water, or loosen the drain plug enough to get a teaspoon of liquid to look for anything unusual.

Do this before starting engine! Put a drop on a coffee filter or soft cardboard business card to look for other problems.

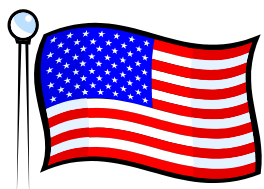

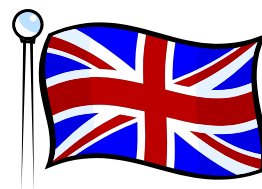
